Last month I spoke about the speculators in the market and how this affects the price of oil and what we pay at the pump. As you have noticed the price of oil has come down considerably. In fact, oil slipped below \$120 a barrel on Monday, August 4th and now overall is down 20% from its July high near \$150 a barrel. Part of this is due to the usual suspects—a weak consumer spending report and the risk that tropical storm Edouard will slam into the gulfcoast. Another reason is that the speculators sold off a lot of their oil positions since oil was dropping and they didn't want to take a loss. Demand is still down in the United States and in some areas abroad. Supertanker owners are leaving more ships at anchor after rising fuel costs. Several congressional representatives have been trying to get a bill passed that would help to regulate part of this industry that is not regulated but all of their efforts to this point have failed. We can only hope that they will continue with their efforts. The Democratic Congress also isn't budging opening up the drilling in the U.S. Strange that China can drill in our waters but WE can't. Makes you wonder who got paid for that decision! Be sure to read more of the articles in the newsletter. I have tried to keep you informed on several issues that are floating around and need some attention. Also, I will be bringing gifts again for those that can answer questions about the newsletter! State Representative Phil King is going to be our speaker this month so please plan on not missing this very informative meeting. Make your reservations and bring a guest. **STATE REPRESENTATIVE PHIL KING
TO SPEAK TO BLRWW**



As State Representative for the 61st District, Phil King represents the people of Parker and Wise Counties in the Texas Legislature. He has earned a reputation as a principle-driven conservative who consistently provides key leadership in passing some of Texas' most sweeping public policy

legislation.

King serves as Chairman of the Regulated Industries Committees, one of the most powerful committees in the Texas House, where he has worked to promote competition in the electricity and telecommunications markets. King co-chairs the Electric Utility Restructuring Legislative Oversight Committee, a joint committee of the Texas House and Senate. King also serves on the Civil Practices Committee and the Redistricting Committee.

Additionally, he sits as a member of the joint House and Senate Committee on the Power of Eminent Domain. King is also on the board of directors for the Tower Institute for Strategic Analysis and Action in Public Policy, an organization that encourages the principles of economic liberty, limited government, and personal responsibility.

Prior to serving in the legislature, King served as a Captain in the Fort Worth Police Department, an instructor at Dallas Baptist University and a Parker County Justice of the Peace. He received a BBA and MBA from Dallas Baptist University and in 1993 earned a law degree from Texas Wesleyan University.

Currently, he is a practicing attorney in Weatherford. Representative King and his

family are active members of Trinity Bible Church. Phil and his wife Terry are the proud parents of six children and one grandson.

YOU'RE PART OF THE PROBLEM!

It is Time for America to Speak up!

Human beings only have two ways to deal with one another: reason and force. If you want me to do something for you, you have a choice of either convincing me via argument, or force me to do your bidding under threat of force. Every human interaction falls into one of those two categories, without exception. Reason or force, that's it.

In a truly moral and civilized society, people exclusively interact through persuasion. Force has no place as a valid method of social interaction and the only thing that removes force from the menu is the personal firearm, as paradoxical as it may sound to some.

When I carry a gun, you cannot deal with me by force. You have to use reason and try to persuade me, because I have a way to negate your threat or employment of force. The gun is the only personal weapon that puts a 100 pound woman on equal footing with a 220 pound mugger, a 75 year old retiree on equal footing with a 19 year old gang banger, and a single gay guy on equal footing with a carload of drunk guys with baseball bats. The gun removes the disparity in physical strength, size, or numbers between a potential attacker and a defender. There are plenty of people who consider the gun as the source of bad force equations. These are the people who think that we'd be more civilized if all guns were removed from society, because a firearm makes it easier for a (armed) mugger to do his job. That, of course, is only true if the mugger's potential victims are mostly disarmed either by choice or by legislative fiat—it has no validity when most of a mugger's potential marks are armed. People who argue for the banning of arms ask for automatic rule by the young, the strong, and the many, and that's the exact opposite of a civilized society. A mugger, even an armed one, can only make a successful living in a society where the state has granted him a force monopoly.

Then there's the argument that the gun makes confrontations lethal that otherwise would only result in injury. This argument is fallacious in several ways. Without guns involved,

confrontations are won by the physically superior party inflicting overwhelming injury on the loser.

People who think that fists, bats, sticks, or stones don't constitute lethal force watch too much TV, where people take beatings and come out of it with a bloody lip at worst. The fact that the gun makes lethal force easier works solely in favor of the weaker defender, not the stronger attacker. If both are armed, the field is level. The gun is the only weapon that's as lethal in the hands of an octogenarian as it is in the hands of a weight lifter. It simply wouldn't work as well as a force equalizer if it wasn't both lethal and easily employable.

When I carry a gun, I don't do so because I am looking for a fight, but because I'm looking to be left alone. The gun at my side means that I cannot be forced, only persuaded. I don't carry it because I'm afraid, but because it enables me to be unafraid. It doesn't limit the actions of those who would interact with me through reason, only the actions of those who would do so by force. It removes from the equation...and that's why carrying a gun is a civilized act.

A LITTLE MILITARY HISTORY

On July 29, 1967, one hundred and thirty four men died and sixty-two were wounded in a fire on an aircraft carrier, the USS Forrester. Among the planes waiting to take off, a missile misfired and hit another plane, sparking a massive inferno.

As bombs and fuel exploded, Lt. Commander John McCain jumped out of his own plane and ran toward the flames, attempting to rescue another pilot. An exploding bomb then injured McCain in the chest and legs.

With his own ship out of commission, McCain volunteered for duty aboard the USS Oriskany. Three months later, he was shot down. He spent five and a half years in a communist prison, much of that time in solitary

BY THE NUMBERS

Something Is Out of Wack—

Assuming **proven oil reserves** of 264 billion barrels, the value of Saudi Arabia’s oil “in the ground” as of 6/30/08 (valued at \$140 a barrel) was \$37 trillion, **more than 2 and a half times** the value of the total US stock market (\$14.1 trillion) as of the end of last month (source: BP Global, Wilshire).

Nuclear Power---There are 104 licensed nuclear reactors in the USA producing **approximately 20%** of the electricity generated in the country today. The last reactor built in the nation began construction in March 1977 in Louisiana. The **top 3 US states** for the generation of nuclear power are **Illinois, Pennsylvania and South Carolina**. 19 US states have no active nuclear plants (source: Dept of Energy).

Coal, Not Oil, For Now---80% of the power produced in China is generated **from coal** (source: Financial Times).

Not Much---The maximum **Social Security retirement benefit** that could be earned by an individual reaching full retirement age in the year 2008 (i.e. at age 65 years and 10 months) is \$2185 a month or an annualized \$26,220 (source: Social Security Administration).

Separate From Medicare---A 65 year old couple would need to set aside **\$215,000 today** (i.e. at present value amount) in order to cover their **out of pocket health care expenditures** over the subsequent 15 year period (source: Fidelity, Barron’s).

Changing Directions---Following Fed Chairman Ben Bernanke’s comments in June that **shifted the focus** of the nation’s central bank from a **slow growth economy** to that of **rising inflation concerns**, the Fed funds futures market reflected on 6/13/08 an 88% chance of a rate hike at the Fed’s 8/05/08 meeting. If the Fed does raise rates at its August meeting, that action will come **just 97 days** after its most recent rate cut, the **quickest turnaround** from “cutting to increasing” since March 1988 (source: Federal Reserve, Wall Street Journal).

Oil Production In The USA---The last oil refinery to be built in the USA was in Garyville, LA in 1976 or **32 years ago**. There are 148 operating refineries in the country today, **less than half** the nation’s total in 1985. The reduction in the number of operating refineries is the result of 1) older, less efficient plants being shut down, 2) the concentration of oil production in newer, larger, more efficient plants, and 3) pressure from environmentalists and the guidelines mandated in the federal Clean Air Act (source: C-Span).


